W. now appearing N. $23\frac{1}{2}$ W. by ye same land 134 perches to a white oak stump another corner of ye ^{sd} Justis's land and continuing the same course by land (suppos'd to be vacant altho the ^{sd} Mouns Justis has sometime pretended to claim it) 66 perch^s more to a — in the line of Thomas Shutes land then by the same E. N. E. 26 perches to other land belonging to Isaac Norris ~~and~~ then by the same and by land lately Thomas Callowhills (now John Penn's ^{S. S. E.} 220 perches to a La mark'd bla- oak in the line of Job Goodson's land. Then by ^{the old marked line of} ^{W. S. W.} the ^{sd} Goodson's land 26 perches or there about to the place of begining containing thirty two acres.
