Whereas William Allen of our City of Philadelphia, Esquire, hath set forth to us that he is legally vested of the right to the Quantity of Eight Hundred Acres of Land within our Province, being Part of Five Thousand Acres the Original Purchase made of our late Father William Penn, Esq^r since deceased, by George Palmer then of Nonesuch in the County of Essex in Great Britain also deceased, which said Quantity of Eight Hundred Acres was formerly pretended to be survey'd on the Borders and within our Manor of Richland in the county of Bucks, but upon Enquiry and search made by our Deputy Surveyor of the said County no Lines or marked Trees of such Survey can be discovered or found; wherefore the said William Allen hath requested that we would be pleased to grant our Warrant for surveying the like Quantity of Eight Hundred Acres of Land elsewhere within our said Province.

These are therefore to authorize and require you to survey or cause to be surveyed unto the said William Allen according to the method of Townships appointed the said Quantity of Eight Hundred Acres of Land and make Return thereof into the Secretary's Office in order for Confirmation. Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Land office, by vertue of certain Powers from the said Proprietaries at Philadelphia this fourteenth day of November Anno Domini 1741.
