 twenty sixth day of March 1733, <sup>for the Laying out to James Steel 2400<sup>a</sup> of land</sup> Surveyed unto <sup>the 3<sup>d</sup></sup> James Steel  
 a tract of Land Situate in Old Cowissihoppin in the County  
 of Philada. Beginning at a post a Corner of John Waggenman's  
 Land thence by the same North East one hundred twenty  
 nine perches to a post thence by sd Waggenman's Land  
 North west Eighteen perches to a post thence by Vacant  
 Land North East Ninety Seven perches to a post thence by  
 land of Jacob Engar South East one hundred twenty  
 three perches to a post thence by Vacant Land South West  
 two hundred twenty Six perches to a post in a line of Henry  
 Frys land thence by the same & land of John Waggenman  
 North west one hundred & five perches to ye place of Beginning  
 Containing one hundred & ffifty Acres with the usual Allow-  
 ance of six p Cent. Surveyed October 10th. 1733 By Nicho. Scull.
