



Surveyed at the Request of James Steel This Tract of Land Beginning at a black oak standing in the Line of Tat Tomn's Land then East forty perches to a Long black oak then South by the said Land one hundred and sixty perch to a post then north East three hundred and thirty two perches by vacant Land to a small Spanish oak then north west two hundred perches by vacant Land to a Chestnut oak then South west two hundred perches by vacant Land to a Spanish oak then South Eighty perch to the place of beginning. Containing three hundred and three acres. Surveyed on the 12 of the 8 month in the year 1733 by _____ Lying in Buck-County over the west Branch of Delaware. This in Right of Geo. Palmer who sold to John Chapman. Wm. Allen who sold to James Steel.
