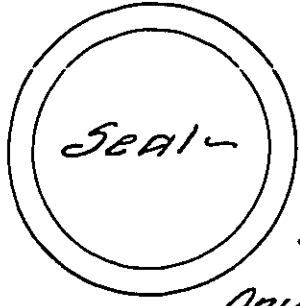


Pennsylvania S. S.



By the Commissioners of Property.

Whereas in or about the year of our Lord 1686. There was Survey'd unto William Markham in Right of his Original Purchase a certain Tract of Land Situate above the Manor of Gilberts on the River Schuylkill in the County of Philada. containing three Thousand five hundred Acres as in & by the returne of Survey appears And Whereas by Severall Grants & Surveys since made to other persons within the lines of the said Tract the same is reduced to about two Thousand Acres which said Quantity being now vested in James Steel of Philadelphia by Sundry Descents & Grants from the Heirs & Descendants of the said William Markham who is long since Deceased He the said James Steel hath Earnestly requested of us our Warrant to Resurvey the same These are therefore to Authorize & Require thee to Resurvey or cause to be Resurvey'd unto the said James Steel the said two Thousand Acres of Land still remaining of the aforesd. Tract According to the lines & bounds which now are, Exclusive of the aforesd. later Grants to other persons To hold to him the said James Steel his heirs & Assigns forever under the yearly quitrent accruing for the same to the Proprietary from the first Survey thereof and make Return of this resurvey into the Secretarys Office Given under our hands and the lesser Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 18th. day of September Anno Dni. 1729.
