

By virtue of warrant from the Commissioners of Property dated the 22 d day of December 1727. There was Survey'd and laid out on the tenth day of April, 1728. unto James Steel of the City of Philadelphia a certain Tract of Land in Oley in the County of Philadelphia beginning at a post at a Corner of Richard Gregory's Land. Thence by the same North East two hundred thirty five perches to another Corner of the said Gregory's Land Then on the same Course by vacant Land sixty five perches to a lin. tree Then by vacant Land north west one hundred and sixty six perches to a post Then by vacant Land South west one hundred and forty perches to a post. Then by vacant land North west one hundred and sixty perches Then by vacant land South South West one hundred and nineteen perches to a black oak Then by vacant land South East forty perches to a post Then by vacant land South west one hundred and twenty perches to a post Then by vacant Land South East one hundred and twenty perches to a post. Then by vacant land North East eighty perches to a hickery Then by vacant Land South East one hundred sixty six perches to the place of beginning containing four hundred ninety two acres.

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this twenty seventh day of September 1910
