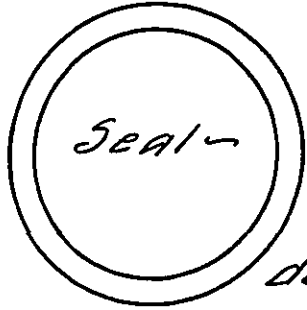


Pensylvania s.s.

These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey and lay out or cause to be Survey'd and Laid out within the said City as near as may be to the place or places where they fell by Allotment, unto the said James Steel the aforsaid three Lots of Ground in proportion to the Several purchases and make Returnes thereof into the Secretarys Office in Order for a further Confirmation Given under our hands & lesser Seal of the Province. at Philadelphia the 25th day of the 1st Month Anno Dni. 1724.
