*of Liberty Land appurtenant to the said Original purchase*  
*where the said Lot fell by Allotment or as near thereunto*  
*as may be and where the said Liberty Land may be found*  
*vacant and make Returns of both into the Secretary's*  
*Office in Order for a further Confirmation Given under*  
*our hands and the lesser Seal of the Province at Phila-*  
*delphia the 25<sup>th</sup> day of the 3<sup>d</sup> month Anno Dni 1725.*
