Courses and Distances

Beginning at a corner on the line of Schuylkill County
 at a heap of stones thence N 42° E 5 miles and 100 perches
 to a corner on Little Mountain thence N 45° E 5 miles
 and 100 perches to a corner on Bucks Mountain thence
 S 70° E 9 miles and 100 perches to a corner in the line be-
 tween Luzerne and Schuylkill or Northampton counties.

Note. No lines could be run to the several points con-
 templated by the distances given in the act of Assembly.
