Pittsburgh May 1799

I have taken the liberty of troubling you with the enclosed Deed of Donation Land, which was formerly in this State but since running the line fell into the State of New York. I gave Genl. Braddock some considerable time ago, a power to transact this Business for me, which he politely promised to do, if he has done it (which I have not the satisfaction to know) there will be little difficulty in getting another Deed at the Office - this if I seem cannot be done will tell the original one is surrendered, will upon therefore my friend deliver the enclosed - and receive a New one for the same quantity of Acres - which will be free of Costs - It would be well to call on Genl. Braddock - who perhaps may assist you in this Business - and I sincerely wish you safe to White and ben happy and am with real respects
