 State of Pennsylvania the year with great honor
 under the banner of coat arms - agreeable to
 an act of the Legislature of Pennsylvania, and so
 Moreover, the said John Joseph, order and direct the Secretary of the
 said State, or his successors, to issue to the said John Joseph
 or assignee, in his or their own name as assignee of the
 the said John Joseph a Patent or deed for the land
 above said and on receipt of the same, so hereby making
 and confirm any receipt or other instrument in
 writing, that the said John Joseph may needfully
 sign or execute to be signed in bearing the same
 as if he were fully and lawfully and lawfully
 in testimony whereof have hereunto set my hand
 and seal this 20th day of Aug^r 1792
