rents, wares, dues, accounts, and other demands whatsoever; also all other emo-
luments that may be due me from the State of Pennsylvania for
a full and valuable Consideration to me in hand well
and truly Paid by Abraham Dutton who assigns
and assigns all his right due from the State of Penn-
sylvania to the only Proper use, benefit and behoof
of him the said Abraham Dutton and to his heirs and
assigns forever

giving and granting unto ^{our} said attorney, by these presents, ^{out} full power,
strength, and authority, in and about the premises, to have, use, and take, all law-
ful ways and means, in ^{our} name for the recovery thereof, and upon the receipt
of any such debts, dues, or any other thing or things, acquittances or other dis-
charges, for ^{me} and in ^{my} name to make, seal, and deliver all and every other
act and acts in the law whatsoever, necessary to be done in and about the premises,
as fully, largely, and amply, to all intents and purposes, as ^{we} might or could do,
if ^{we} was personally present; and ^{we} do also empower ^{our} said attorney by these pre-
sents, to make one or more substitutes under him, for the purposes above mentioned.
