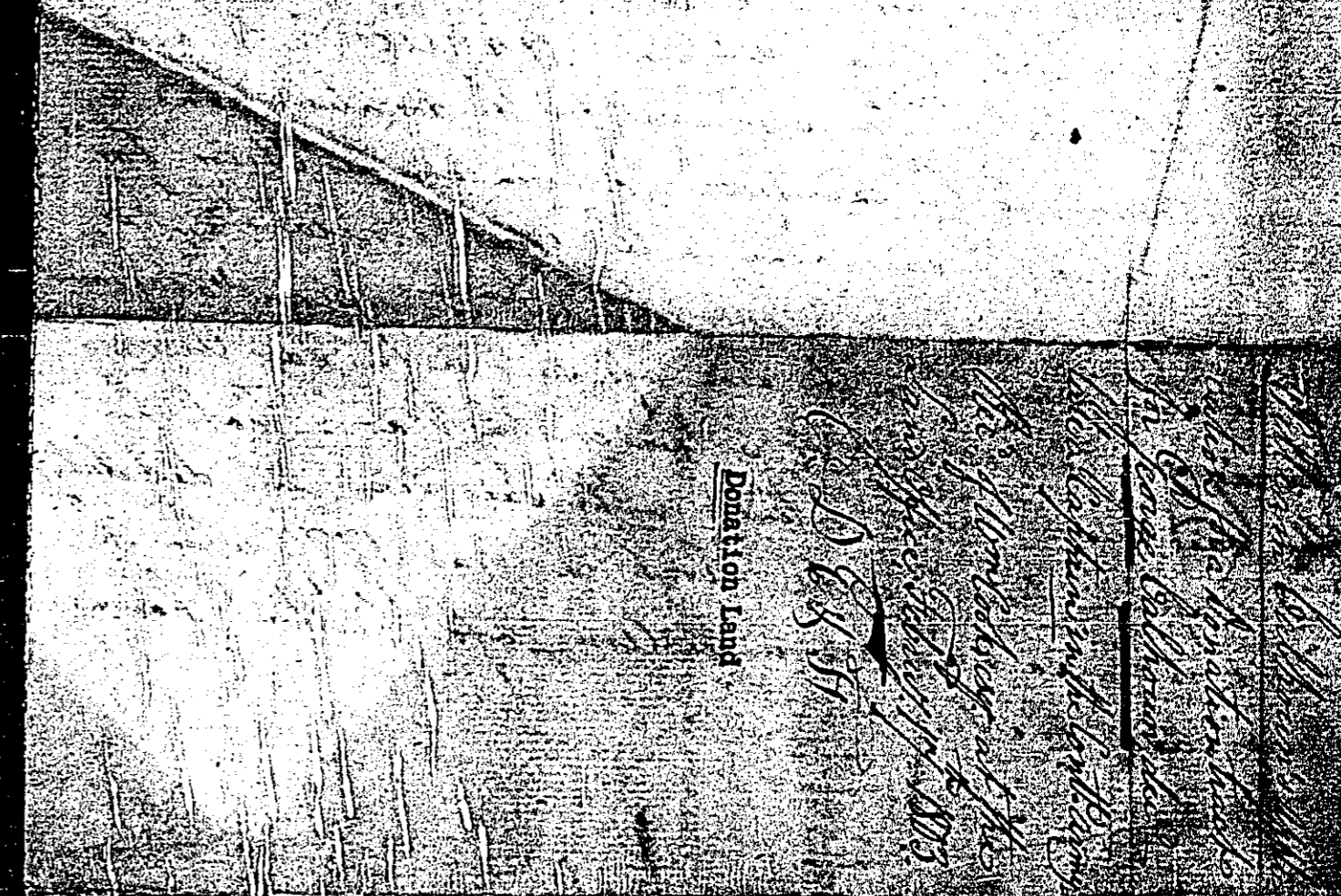


For Northumberland County; Before me the subscriber one of the  
Justices of the Peace in and for Northumberland County came  
Thomas Grant Esquire of the Township of Augusta in the  
County aforesaid, and being duly sworn according to law, said  
that he was well acquainted with Captain George Calhoun  
formerly of the County aforesaid, whom this Deponent always  
understood to be a Captain in the tenth Regiment comman-  
ded by Lieutenant Colonel Richard Humphreys, in the  
Pennsylvania line, in the late war between Great  
Britain and the United States of America; That during  
that war in the month of December, in the year of our Lord one  
thousand seven hundred and seventy eight, Captain Calhoun  
came to the House of this Deponent near Fort Augusta side,  
and continued so until he died, which he did on the  
day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred  
and seventy nine; That this Deponent was appointed one of his  
Executors, and is now in possession of receipts for his General expen-  
ses, which enables this Deponent to recollect the time of his  
decease,
