Personally came before me one of the Justices of the Peace for said County Wm Beale and being sworn as Law directs Deposeth and saith that he has lived near James Chambers ^{Senr} of Millford Township Mifflin County upwards of thirty years and that he was well acquainted with him and his family in his lifetime and which was his son James Chambers, and John Chambers the latter said to have died in the American army without ever being married or having lawfull issue, the former after serving till the end of the War, died about two years ^{as this Depoent understood} after the peace without ever being Married or having lawfull issue, he also had a son named Brandle Chambers who is long since dead and died without being Married or having lawfull issue ~~the~~ the said James Chambers Senr. had two Daughters ^{with} Elizabeth Chambers who also died without lawfull issue; the only one of the family that is now living is ~~of the~~ Mary Bartley late Chambers who is lawfully Married to William Bartley and has issue one Child, and as the said James Chambers Senr. died intestate as this Depoent ever understood and believes, therefore it would appear that by the Laws of this State that the said Bartley and his wife are the only heirs at Law to the tract of Land that the said James Chambers died seized and possessed of joining Land Warranted in the name of James Shenady on the east John King ^{late} George Caroner on the West and Land joining Land Warranted & Surveyed in the name of Ralph Sturtt. on the South, and situate in Millford Township Mifflin County. Sworn and subscribed this 22^d day of January 1808. - Wm Beale
