Said Deponent, & the said John Chambers Both belonged
to the third Regiment of Pennsylvania Troops,
Commanded by Col. Craig, & Belonging to Captain
Tho. Butler's Company, & the said Chambers was
in the same Regt with said Deponent, & said Deponent
Further Saith that the said Chambers Deceased at
Brykenridge Hospital some time in July in the year
1780, and he the said Deponent further Saith that a
Certain James M. Lonnall, James Magill and him dug
the grave for said Chambers & helped Bury him
therein, - & said Deponent further Saith that he is
Well acquainted With Mary Barkley, Late Mary Chambers
& that he Believes her to be the only Sister or heir
to the said John Chambers, now Living
