 and receive from the Secretary of the Land Office of the State aforesaid, a Deed or patent for
 two hundred acres of Donation Land I am intitled to & surveyed, the west Side of the river
 Ohio, by my late services, as a soldier in Captain Robinsons Company of foot,
 and further I do hereby fully empower him the said John Barber to do and execute all and
 every such forth or other acts, matters and things whatsoever which shall or may be
 requisite or expedient in and concerning the premises, as fully amply & effectually to
 all intents and purposes, as the said John Cox, could or might do, if I were personally
 present, - and I the said John Cox do hereby agree, to ratify and confirm what in and
 my said attorney shall legally or lawfully do, or cause to be done, in and concerning the
 premises, by Virtue of these presents; - In witness whereof I the said John Cox have
 hereunto set my hand & Seal, Dated the fourth Day of June, in the year of our Lord
 one thousand Seven hundred & eighty seven
