 district of the County of Common Pleas of Penn-
 sylvania do certify that Robert Dixon, a native
 of west Haver in the County of Dauphin, formerly an
 ensign, first Sergeant of Capt. Nathaniel Smith's Company
 of the Pennsylvania, was personally known to me, while
 on the Expedition to Quebec under the Command of Genl
 the General at the year 1758, and that I saw
 within a few feet of him the said Dixon, when a 36th
 and ball, fired from the battery on the night of
 Quebec, struck and carried off his leg, and that
 he died of the wound the following morning and
 was buried with military honors.
