Before me Michael Hoillegas one of the Aldermen of the said City appeared Samuel Dunscomb now of Dutchess County in the State of New York who on his solemn oath doth depose and say that he was Twenty eight years of age on the first day of July last, That he enlisted in the service of the United States with Captain Samuel Talbot under Colonel Richard Sturton in the Pennsylvania line in January One thousand seven hundred and eighty three and was regularly discharged from the said service in the month of June in the same year, being at the close of the War, but that he has by some accident lost the said discharge, That he is the identical Samuel Dunscomb who was enlisted and served in the said Regiment in manner aforesaid And that he has never empowered any person whatever other than Bernard Merckle on the twenty fifth day of September last to take or receive in his behalf his this deponents Certificate or to obtain any grant of the Lands or other matters due to him in pursuance of the said service, And further this deponent saith not
