The Petition of Heronimus Eckman  
Humbly Sheweth

That Your Petitioner, purchased from John Gibson Emberson and Henry Gibson two soldiers who served during the American War and were discharged in the year 1783 whose discharges are herewith sent And Whereas Your humble petitioner hath frequently made application for the land allotted ~~and~~ said soldiers by the law of this commonwealth and hath paid valuable consideration therefor: have not been able to obtain patents for the land so due to the said John Gibson Emberson and Henry Gibson — Your humble petitioner beg leave to represent that application was made during the sickness in Philadelphia and sundrie times since as the documents herewith sent will evince

Therefore humbly pray that your petitioner may be allowed to obtain patents for said land due to the said John Gibson Emberson & Henry Gibson agreeable to the laws of this commonwealth & your petitioner as in duty bound shall pray
