of Penn^a or to any other person appointed to
grant and Deliver Patents to Soldiers who served in
the Penn^a Line in the Army of the United States to
the end of the War -

Sir
Please to deliver to Col. Francis Johnston of
Philadelphia a Patent in my name for two
hundred Acres of Land being a Donation allowed me
for my Services in the Pennsylvania Line, in Col.
Josiah Hammers Regt and Capt Humphreys
Company. During the last War and his Receipt
shall be your sufficient Voucher
Hamilton County Territory of the United States his
North west of the River Ohio - Roger Finney
May 18th 1797 mark

Seretary of the United States Northwest of the River Ohio
Hamilton Co } Personally appeared before me John Armstrong
Esq. one of the Justices of the Court of
Common Pleas for said County Roger Finney Alias
Roger O'Henry who being duly sworn Deposeth
that he served in the Army of the United States
until the end of the War When discharged belonged
to Capt Humphreys Company Col. Hammers
Regt that he never sold or transferred his claim
to Donation Lands to any person What soever
Sworn & Subscribed before me this 18 day of May
1797 -
