appointed and by these Presents, do make, constitute  
and appoint John Bullinger of Philadelphia, my true  
and lawful Attorney for me, but for his own use, to receive  
the two hundred acres of land, granted by the State of  
Pennsylvania. And I do request the Officer for the time  
being, to issue the same, to the said John Bullinger, and  
his receipt shall be sufficient for the same, as much as if  
I were personally present, and I do hereby ratify and  
confirm all that my said Attorney shall do in the  
Premises. Given under my Hand and Seal at Reading  
the twenty second day of December, Anno Domini, one  
thousand, seven hundred and ninety five.
