Philadelphia June 15th 1800

I am about setting off for the City of Washington and have taken the liberty to request your attention to the claim of the Widow of Serjeant Innis - the Certificate of her marriage with some other papers which had been with Mr Nicholson, as also with Mr Joseph Howell were deposited by me at the Office with you, not where her claim was filed - the Old Lady wants her land most - but she thinks that the Certificate of her marriage is very necessary at her death - Our friend Mr John Meyers I believe & Mr Smith her nephews will do all in his power to assist in this business which for the sake of Justice & Humanity I wish may have a decided preference and immediate and persevering attention - & desired yours
