

Know all Men By these Presents, That I **Thomas Keeland** of **Pennsylvania** in the first **Pennsylvania Regiment**

in the service of the United States of America, for value and the full consideration money, to me in hand paid, at, and before the execution hereof by **Henry Hipple** the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, HAVE, and hereby Do grant, bargain, sell, transfer, convey and confirm unto **Henry Hipple** his heirs, executors, administrators, and assigns for ever, all the right, title and interest whatsoever, in law and equity, which I now have, or which **Henry Hipple** his heirs, executors, or administrators, may hereafter have, to the lands, pay, depreciation, clothing, rations, rewards, bounties, gratuities, prize-moneys, and every other arrears, claim and demand whatever, due and owing **to me** from and by the United States of any particular state: and I do hereby for myself my heirs, executors and administrators covenant and agree, to and with the said **Henry Hipple** his heirs, executors and administrators, will, at any time hereafter, at the reasonable cost and charges of **Henry Hipple** his heirs, executors and administrators, to make, execute, perform, and fulfill, all and singular the premises and claims hereby granted and assigned, or intended so to be. And do make, constitute and appoint **Henry Hipple** my true and lawful attorney, irrevocably to demand and receive, sue for, and recover from the United States, or any particular State, or any person or persons, acting, by or under their or either of their authority, all and singular the premises, right, claims, and emoluments herein above recited and sold, and now withheld and detained from me by the United States or Pennsylvania with full power, also, attorney or attorneys for that purpose, to make and substitute, and to do all lawful acts requisite for effecting the premises, hereby ratifying and confirming all that my said attorney, or substitute or substitutes, shall do therein by virtue hereof.

IN WITNESS, whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this **fourth** day of **December** Anno Domini, **1793**.
