

Know all Men by these

Present, that I, *William Kelly*, in the
presence of the United States, hath made, ordained, and constituted
and by these presents do make, ordain and constitute, and in my place and stead
put and depute *John Kelly* of *Philadelphia*
my true and lawful Attorney, irrevocable for me, and in my name and stead, but to the sole use
of him, his heirs and assigns for ever, to ask,
demand, receive, take, and receive all such sums of money, as well as
grants, of lands, tenements, or other demands whatsoever in the United States
or the State of *Pennsylvania* or any other person or persons acting under their
authority, and to give and grant unto my said attorney full power and absolute authority, to
sell and dispose of all and singular the lands, tenements, gratuities and donations, which I may be
entitled to, or of right may claim, in virtue of any act of the United States in Congress assembled
or under the authority of *the United States* for or by reason of my having
served in the said *regiments of the Army*
line and by good and sufficient assurances in the law, to grant, convey and confirm to the pur-
chaser or purchasers, the fee simple and inheritance thereof, hereby granting unto my said attor-
ney full power and authority to appoint one or more attorneys under him or them, for the pur-
pose aforesaid, ratifying and confirming all and singular whatsoever my said attorneys shall or
may do in the premises by virtue hereof: In witness whereof, I have hereunto set my hand
and seal this *third* day of *November* and in the year of our Lord
one thousand seven hundred and *ninety one*
