 lawful Attorney, me and in my Name and to
 my use to ask, demand and receive of and from
 the State of Pennsylvania all warrants, Patents and
 other State Papers which I am or may be entitled to
 or which may be necessary for securing to me any Do-
 nation or other lands to which I may be entitled
 for my services while in the Army of the United
 States and also to ask, demand and receive from the Uni-
 ted States for me and to my use as aforesaid all
 such Warrants and other State Papers as may be
 due and coming to me for writing in and securing
 to me all lands which I may be entitled to or about
 of my services while in the Army of the United
 States as aforesaid, and further to do and perform
 all lawful acts for effecting the premises and for
 writing in me, my heirs and assigns the title of the
 said lands and each and every part thereof, with
 power also an Attorney or Attorneys under him
 to make and substitute. Hereby I ratify my and
 confirming all that my said Attorney or Attorneys or his or
 his or substitutes shall lawfully do by virtue
 hereof. In Witness whereof I have hereunto
