John Kincaid was returned for

Donation Land, in the first Report made to the  
Superior Executive Council, by the late Comptroller  
General of Mr. Nicholson, under the Act of  
Assembly of the 21th of March 1785, but has  
- not been late in his application, no number has  
been drawn against his name, owing to expediency  
of Land to satisfy all the claimants, his application  
is however within the limitation of a former Act  
of Assembly.
