

I certify to whom it may concern that the bearer John Kinkaid was enlisted for the War in the Artillery and Artificer Regiment and was of the Pennsylvania quota of that Regiment - I discharged him as such at Fort Mifflin in the Year 1783 - which he says he lost, but I have yet a perfect recollection of him, he was one of a Detachment of that Regiment, who served under my immediate Orders during my command in the western Country. He was then a usefull and well behaved man - he is clearly entitled to all the emoluments granted by the State to Officers and Soldiers of the Pennsylvania line, which have not already been paid him -
