Before me the Subscribers, one of the Judges of the Court of Common Pleas for and for the County of Lancaster, came Henry Woff, of the Post-Office of Lancaster, Taylor, and Jago upon Part, that in certain Christopher Loringhouse, who now is working in the gunsmiths Shop of Mr. Jacob Diobert, in this Borough, is the same man, whose name is entered in the list of the Soldiers entitled to receive Donation Land; said Henry Woff having known him, when he enlisted here at Lancaster, that he, said Henry Woff, well recollects to have seen him dressed in the Regiments uniform, and that he well knew him, and his wife, and the house, wherein he dwelt, when he was enlisted; the said Henry Woff says further, that he could not recollect to have heard of any other Soldier in this County, which had the same name; and further he says not.
