General Lincoln, your Petitioner had been in the Actual
Service in the Army of the United States, for the Term of
Eleven Months and twenty two Days,

That your Petitioner hath not received any further
Pay or Compensation for his Service aforesaid than four
Months Pay, and that the remainder for his Service is
yet unpaid,

Therefore most Humbly Prays, That
your Honours would be pleased to grant him a Com-
pensation for the residue of the time for his Service
aforesaid,

And your Petitioner as in duty bound will ever pray,
