Personally came Mary O'Hara before me one of the Justices of the peace in and for said County, and Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and being duly sworn according to law, deposed and saith, that to the best of her memory in the month of October in the year one thousand seven hundred and sixty seven Joseph O'Hara and, he was regularly joined in marriage by the Rev. William Knox parish of Dunbar County, of Londonderry Ireland, according to the laws of the Presbyterian Church and the deponent saith three years after she had a son, called William, the only ^{child} alive to the said Joseph O'Hara, and further the deponent saith that in the month of June following, the said Joseph O'Hara sailed for America and by letters recd. from his Brother Arthur O'Hara, he had engaged in the army of the United States, and further this deponent saith not.
