 a certain Tract of Donation Land Granted  
 me by the State of Pennsylvania & and since  
 found to belong to the State of New York  
 and To have a Right, or Patent Ther. another  
 Tract of Land in Law thereof agreeable to Law  
 and, Finally, To do and hereon, or herein To  
 be done or performed all and every matter or thing  
 necessary in and about said Land or Business  
 as fully as I could or would do being personally  
 present, hereby Ratifying and Confirming  
 whatever my said attorney may Lawfully do or  
 Cause to be done in and about the Premises  
 Given under my hand & Seal this 1 day June 1797  
 His Trusty Present Robert Parker Seal
