 Seven hundred and Ninety one. Before me Peter Lohra, Notary
 and Tabellion Publici, in and for the Commonwealth of Pennsylv-
 vania, by Lawful Authority duly Commissioned and Sworn Residing
 in the City of Philadelphia, Personally came Bridget Perry of
 the said City Widow, who being duly Sworn according to Law, did
 depose, declare and say, That she was Lawfully Married to William
 Perry, formerly an Invalid in Colonel Lewis Nicholas's Regiment,
 That the said William Perry departed this life on the twenty fourth
 day of July 1782, in the General Hospital, leaving behind him an
 only Son, who also departed this life at the age of Three years or
 thereabouts, And that there is not now living any other Lawfull
 Child or children, of him the said William Perry.
