 of their Agents for that Purpose appointed, all my Title, Right
 or Claim of Lands, Granted, or to be Granted for my Services
 as a Soldier who had served During the late War, Giving
 and by these Presents Granting to my said Attorney, my sole
 full Power and authority, to take, pursue and follow such legal
 Courses, for the Recovery, Receiving, and obtaining of the Same
 as I myself might or could do, were I Personally Present, and
 upon Receipt of the Same, acquittances and other sufficient
 Warrants, for me and in my Name to make, take, and receive,
 as also one or more attorneys under him to substitute or appoint
 one again at his Pleasure to take, and further to do, perform
 and execute for me and in my Name, all and singular things
 or things which are or may be necessary, touching and
 concerning the Premises, as fully, thoroughly and entirely
 as I the Andrew Pogue, in my own Person, might or could
 do, in and about the Same, Ratifying allowing & confirming
 whatsoever my said attorney, shall Lawfully do concerning
 the Execution of the Premises, by Virtue of these Presents.
