Before me the Subscriber one of the Justices of the peace in and for the said County Personally came Molly Myer the Petitioner who upon her solemn oath taken according to Law, swears that her Husband John Decd. was enlisted in the Township Lancaster Township in Captain Selas Company, and that her said Husband was wounded in the Battle of Brandywine, and that she the Dependant was with him after he was wounded and attended him for about six or seven weeks, and then went home to see her Children, in about four or five weeks afterwards she the Dependant recd. a Letter that her said husband had died, and further swears that -
