allotted to me by the Act of Assembly made and provided  
for my Services in the Pennsylvania Independent Rangers  
in the late war, to have Use and to take all lawful  
ways in Obtaining the same in my Name as if I were  
personally present, Ratifying and Confirming and by  
these presents allowing whatsoever my said attorney  
shall in my name lawfully do or Cause to be done  
in and about the premises by Virtue of these presents
