On the Seventh Day June 1804 before me Judick W. Gilbert Esq one of the Justices of the Peace in and for the County aforesaid came Philip Caldwell who name is hereunto subscribed who being Sworn upon the Holy Evangelist of allmighty God doth depose and say that he was personally acquainted with Edward Swain for several years during the last War that the said Edward Swain was as Sergeant in Captains McGowan's Company in the Invalids bore that this deponent served as a private in Capt Comphells Company in the same bore until the end of the War and this deponent doth further say that the said Edward Swain died in the service of the Pennsylvania line in the Barracks in the County of Philad. some short time before the expiration of the War.
