by these presents, That I Moses Swartwood late Soldier in the Pennsylvania Line in Capt Ennis's Company the 1st Regiment commanded by Collo Harmon and others

for and in consideration of the sum of Ten Dollars to me in hand paid at the execution hereof by Philip Stout of the County of Philadelphia the receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge; Have granted, bargained and sold, assigned and set over, and by these presents do grant bargain and sell, assign and set over, unto the said Philip Stout and his heirs and assigns forever, all the share, right, title, interest, of in, and to certain Military Land Warrants granted to be granted for surveying to me Philip Stout the said acres of Land from the United States, and also two hundred acres, from the state of Pennsylvania in any of the districts appropriated to the bounty of Lands due to the late army of the United States, and the State of Pennsylvania all the Lands surveyed in pursuance thereof unto the said Philip Stout his heirs and assigns, and their proper use and behoof forever. AND I do hereby authorize and empower the said Philip Stout his heirs and assigns, to solicit and take in his or their names, and to his or their proper use and behoof, the patents to be issued on the aforesaid warrants or lands, returned to the board of Treasury or elsewhere; and for further consideration to me in hand paid, by the above named Philip Stout I Do hereby authorize and empower the said Philip Stout or his heirs or assigns, to demand or receive all my pay or arrearages of Pay due to me as a Soldier aforesaid, from the United States or the State of Pennsylvania and to give receipt or receipts, for the same, and to do all lawful acts and things, necessary for effecting the same as fully and absolutely to all intents and purposes, as I might or could do, were I personally present, at the office or elsewhere, and done the same.
