That I John Mulvany in Franklin County, and in the State of Pennsylvania Weaver, for Divers good causes, and considerations, me hereunto moving, have made ordained, constituted, and appointed, and by these presents, do make, Ordain, constitute, and Appoint, my trusty Friend Lawrence Slaney, of the State and County of Blacksmith, my true and lawful attorney, for me and in my Name, and to my Use, to ask, Demand, recover and receive of the Honorable Congress, of the United States, the Military Bounty of Land, Promised to me <sup>(my late & full power)</sup> private Soldier during the war, giving, and by these presents, Granting to my said Attorney, to take pursue and follow such legal courses for the Recovery, receiving, and obtaining of the same as I myself might or could do, were I personally present, and upon the receipt of the same, acquittances, or other sufficient Discharges for me, and in my Name, to make, sign, seal, and Deliver; as also one or more attorney or Attorneys under him to substitute and appoint, and again at his pleasure to revoke; and farther to do, perform and finish, for me, and in my name, all and singular thing or things, which shall or may be necessary, touching and concerning the said Bounty of Land, as fully, Thoroughly, and entirely as I the said John Mulvany, in my own Person might, or could do, in or about the same; ratifying, allowing, and confirming whatsoever my said Attorney shall lawfully do, or cause to be done, in and about the Execution of the said Land; by Virtue of these presents, in Witness whereof, I have hereunto set my Hand and Seal, this Fifth Day of May, one Thousand Seven Hundred and Eighty Nine; and in the Thirteenth Year of American Independence.
