

Know all men by these presents, that I Benjamin Watton of Warrenton Township, Bucks County and Commonwealth of Pennsylvania (late soldier through the Revolutionary War) for divers good causes and Considerations hereunto moving, have made, Ordained, Authored, nominated and Appointed, whereby these presents do make Authored, nominated and Appoint Nathaniel Shedd Esq. now at Lancaster, my true and Lawfull Attorney, for me and in my Name, and for my use and benefit, to ask, demands of Andrew Elliott Esq. a Debt for my Warrant Bonds as a Soldier through the American Wars, and to accept thereof to give a full Acquittance or other sufficient discharge for the same, for me, and in my name to make, deal and deliver, And to do and do Lawfull Acts, and things whatsoever concerning the premises, as fully and in every respect as I myself might or could do, were I personally present, whatsoever my said Attorney shall in my name Lawfully do, or cause to be done, in and about the premises, by virtue of these presents. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this fourth day of March in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and six.
