 have made constituted and appointed and by these
 presents do make constitute and appoint and in my
 place and stead put and Depute my trusty and
 loving friend William Nicks of the County and
 State aforesaid my true and lawfull attorney for
 me and in my name place and stead to call
 upon the Board of property and to receive a
 Patent of a Donation tract of two Hundred acres
 of Land Due to me the said William Nilson
 for serving as Soldier in the Pennsylvania line
 in the Revolutionary War in the 11th Regiment under
 Col^l Hubly and Capt Nicks in witness whereof
 I have hereunto set my hand and seal this
 Nineteenth Day of March one thousand Eight
 Hundred and 11th William Nilson
 Mercer County Pa

To the Secretary of the Land office of Pennsylvania
 on the twentieth Day of March 1804 personally
 appeared before me the Judge in and Justice of
 the peace for said County William Nilson
 and being sworn as Law Direct did declare and
 say that he was the said William Nilson that
 served as a Soldier in the Pennsylvania line
 in the Revolutionary War in the Eleventh
 Regiment under Col^l Hubly and Capt
 Nicks that is mentioned in the above power
 of attorney
