



The Supreme Executive Council of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

To all to whom these Presents shall come, GREETING:

KNOW YE,

That in consideration of the services rendered by Samuel Bryson Esquire Lieutenant

in the late army of the United States there is granted by the said commonwealth unto the said Samuel Bryson

a certain tract or parcel of land lying in the county of Westmoreland in the tenth district of donation Lands beginning at a Poplar tree the numbered Corner and running East by lot N^o 2026 two hundred and sixty one perches to a Sugar Tree thence South by lot N^o 42 one hundred and thirty perches to an Elm thence West by lot N^o 2028 two hundred and sixty one perches to a Beech tree thence North by lot N^o 96 one hundred and thirty perches to the place of beginning containing two hundred acres and allowances of five per cent for roads &c. Numbered MMXXVII

with its appurtenances, unto the said Samuel Bryson his heirs and assigns forever: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract or parcel of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Samuel Bryson his heirs and assigns, to the proper use and behoof of the said Samuel Bryson his heirs and assigns forever, free and clear of all restrictions and reservations as to mines, royalties, quit-rents or otherwise, excepting and reserving only the fifth part of all gold and silver ore for the use of this commonwealth, to be delivered at the pit's mouth clear of all charges.

IN WITNESS whereof The Honorable Charles Biddle Esquire, Vice President of the Supreme Executive Council, hath hereunto set his hand, and caused the State seal to be affixed, the twentieth day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty seven and of the Commonwealth the twelfth
