To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:



Know ye,

That in consideration of the services rendered by John Kinkead <sup>privately</sup> in the late Army of the United States, Pennsylvania there is granted by the said Commonwealth unto the said John Kinkead a certain Tract of land called Mount-

Resolution N<sup>o</sup> 297.

Situate in Donation District N<sup>o</sup> 2, West of Allegheny river now Butler County

Beginning at a Corner thence by Lot N<sup>o</sup> 292, West two hundred sixty one perches to a Corner, thence by Lot N<sup>o</sup> 312, South one hundred thirty perches to a Corner, thence by Lot N<sup>o</sup> 293, East two hundred sixty one perches to a Corner, and thence by Lot N<sup>o</sup> 294, South one hundred thirty perches to the Beginning. Containing two hundred. four and thirteenth of six ft. Cont for roads &c. Which said Tract was surveyed in pursuance of an Act of the General Assembly passed the 24<sup>th</sup> day of February 1755.

To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land, with the appurtenances, unto the said John Kinkead and his Heirs to the use of him the said John Kinkead

free and clear of all restrictions and reservations as to Mines, Royalties, Quit-rents or otherwise, excepting and reserving only the fifth part of all Gold and Silver Ore for the use of this Commonwealth, to be delivered at the pit's mouth, clear of all charges. In Testimony whereof, I have set my Hand, and caused the Great Seal of the State to be affixed to these Presents, at Lancaster this eighth day of September, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and two - and of the Commonwealth the twenty-seventh.
