

The Supreme Executive Council of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

To all to whom these Presents shall come GREETING :

**KNOW YE,** That in consideration of the services rendered by *James McFarland* <sup>late</sup> *Lieutenant* in the army of the United States there is granted by the said commonwealth unto *the said James McFarland*

a certain tract or parcel of land lying in the county of Westmoreland on the tenth District of the Donation Lands Beginning at an Iron Wood tree the numbered corner and running East by Lot N<sup>o</sup> 1927 Two hundred and sixty one perches to a Birch tree thence South by Lot N<sup>o</sup> 1928 One hundred and thirty perches to a Birch tree thence West by Lot N<sup>o</sup> 1929 Two hundred and sixty one perches to an Ash tree thence South by Lot N<sup>o</sup> 1925 One hundred and thirty perches to the place of Brwinners containing Two hundred Acres and allowance of six perches for Roads *Numbered MDCCLXXXVII*

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract or parcel of land, with the appurtenances, unto the said *James McFarland* his heirs and assigns forever, to the only proper use and behoof of the said *James McFarland* his Heirs and Assigns forever

free and clear of all restrictions and reservations as to mines, royalties, quit-rents or otherwise, excepting and reserving only the fifth part of all gold and silver ore for the use of this commonwealth, to be delivered at the pit's mouth clear of all charges. IN WITNESS whereof *His Excellency Benjamin Franklin* Esquire, President of the Supreme Executive Council, hath hereunto set his hand, and caused the state seal to be affixed the *Sixth* day of *June* in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty seven and of the commonwealth the *Eleventh*
