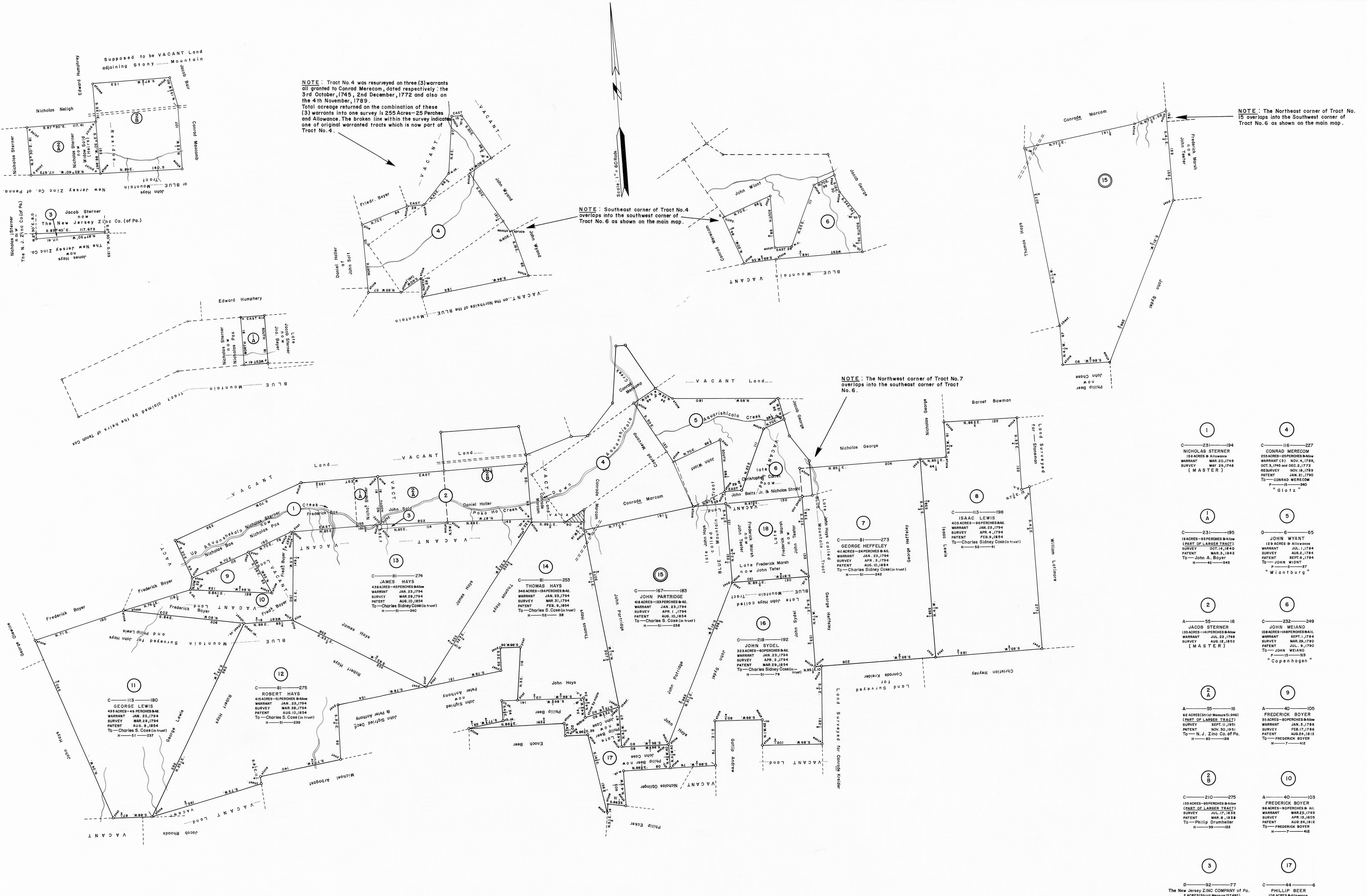


NOTE: Tract No. 4 was resurveyed on three (3) warrants all granted to Conrad Mercom, dated respectively: the 3rd October, 1745, 2nd December, 1772 and also on the 4th November, 1789. Total acreage returned on the combination of these (3) warrants into one survey is 255 Acres—25 Perches and Allowance. The broken line within the survey indicates one of original warranted tracts which is now part of Tract No. 4.

NOTE: Southeast corner of Tract No. 4 overlaps into the southwest corner of Tract No. 6 as shown on the main map.

NOTE: The Northeast corner of Tract No. 15 overlaps into the Southwest corner of Tract No. 6 as shown on the main map.

NOTE: The Northwest corner of Tract No. 7 overlaps into the southeast corner of Tract No. 6.



A CONNECTED DRAFT of twenty (20) tracts of land, which when surveyed, were situate as follows: fourteen (14) in Towamensing Township, Northampton (now Carbon) County; four (4) on the Aquashicola Creek, Bucks (now Carbon) County; and two (2) in Lehigh Township, Northampton (now Carbon) County. The draft has been constructed from and compared with the original drafts on file in the Bureau of Land Records, Department of Community Affairs, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, under the direction of Edward D. Price, Director.
