



Surveyed on the twenty sixth day of Feb 1733 To James Stover a certain Tract of Land situate on a branch of the River Skulkill called Cundenihelca in the County of Philada<sup>a</sup> Beginning at a white oak a Corner of Tscherniak's land thence by the same North west thirty two perches to another white oak being also a Corner of the said Tscherniak's land thence by Vacant land North East four hundred and Eighty perches to a post thence by Vacant land South East one hundred and three perches to a white oak thence by Vacant South West one hundred perches to a hickory standing on the East side of the said Branch being a Corner of Isaac Stover's land thence across the said Branch North west six perches to \_\_\_\_\_ standing on the west side thereof thence down the severall Courses of the same to the first mentioned white oak or place of Beginning Containing two hundred <sup>seventy five</sup> acres with usual allowance
