



By virtue of a warrant dated the twenty first day of December one thousand seven hundred and ninety two No. 3561, there was surveyed on the 20th day of July A. D. 1793, unto John Nicholson the above described Tract of one Thousand acres, situate on the waters of Tobys Creek now Jefferson County in the last purchase District No. 5.

Note. the return of the above survey, was delivered by me to John Barren on or about the 27th day of August, 1793, he being the Chief Clerk of the Surveyor Generals Office, but it appearing that the same is not to be found filed in said Office, a demand was made upon me by the Commissioners appointed under the Act entitled an Act for the more speedy and effectual collection of certain debts due to this Commonwealth, in pursuance of the sixth section of the supplement to the said Act, passed March 19th 1807, to make return of the same. John Nicholson being interested in the same.

William P. Brady being duly sworn according to law, doth declare & say, that he made the survey as above returned, and that the facts above set forth are true.
