Thence down the same on the several thereof to a Corner of Thomas Scott's Land near a Marked Gum. Thence by James Moonie's Land S. 44° E. 40 perches to a post, S. 30° E. 208 perches to a Stone and N. 68° E. 31 perches to a Spanish Oak standing on the West Side of said Creek, Thence down the same on the several Courses thereof to the place of Beginning.
