



The above Draught describes a Small Tract of <sup>1000</sup> 33 1/4 A. & 10 ps. & Allowance as usual, which <sup>was</sup> Survey'd by my Father the 12<sup>th</sup> (June) of May 1745. for a certain John Gibson, by Warrant of the Gth. of May preceding & formerly Return'd, But at the Request of Geo. Conroy Executor to the Estate of Mary Grymes, Deceased, the above new Return is made with the addition of 7 A. & 150 ps. & Allowance lying contiguous, being a stripe between two Maryland Patent Tracts, the Bounds whereof were not exactly known at the time. the above 33 1/4 A. was Survey'd. Mary Grymes (it is said) in her life time purchased John Gibson's. Right whose warrant was for 50 A. She also had a warrant of the same date with Gibson's by which she claim'd this addition. Survey'd 27<sup>th</sup> 11. mo. 1769. By Geo. Churchman

The Warr<sup>t</sup>. granted to Mary Grymes & Children by which the above Tract of 7 A. 150 ps. was Survey'd is dated the 9<sup>th</sup>. May. 1745.
