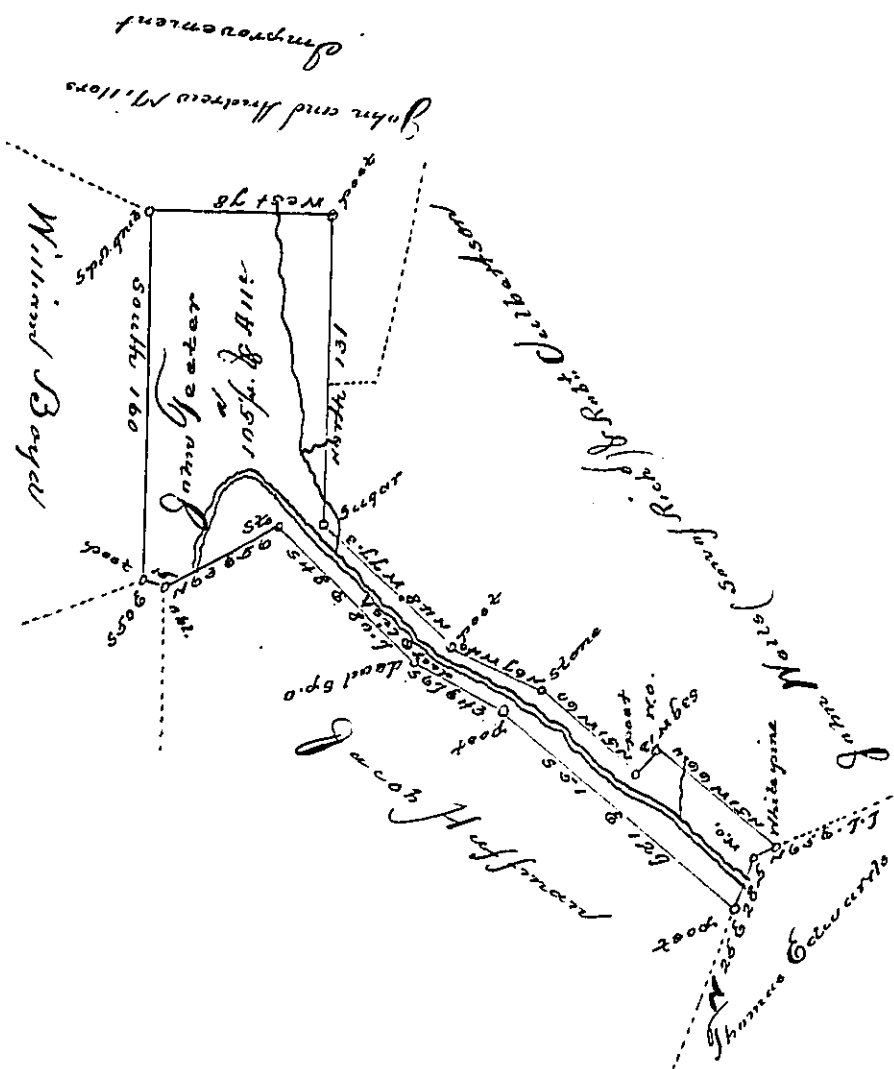

 Now in Southampton Township, Somerset County (formerly Londerry Township  
 Bedford County) and Surveyed the 9th day of November 1793, by George Woods  
 Esq<sup>r</sup> Late D.S. as appears by his official Draught remaining in my Office. In  
 pursuance of a Warrant granted unto John Tector dated the 23<sup>d</sup> day of October  
 1792 — Certified the 28<sup>th</sup> December 1804
