



A Draught of a Tract of Land called Conventions situate in Plumstead Township Bucks County. Surveyed the 11th Day of April 1767 to John M^c Glaughlin in Virtue of an Application & Order of Survey thereon bearing Date the 28th of June 1766 p^t John Hart

N. B. Besides John M^c Glaughlins Application for the above described Tract there are three others of prior Date each designed for a piece of Land somewhere adjoining the above mentioned Land of Robt M^c Farland. The Applicants were Isaac Stroude, John Brittain & Philip Fuchs. On receiving the s^d Applications, and attending in order to execute them a Son of J^r Brittain went with me & pointed out the Place where the Vacancy should lie; but I could find none & therefore made Return of all three Applications - no Vacancy - Brittain & Fuchs have no claim to the above described Land in Virtue of their Applications, as it lies in another part where none was expected. It is disputed whether this^d described Land be really vacant, or is only an Overplus contained in the Tract formerly surveyed to James Potts, of which it was always deemed to be a part. It was not till of late known to be either vac^t or Overplus, when a Resurvey was made on an adjoining Tract and the given Length of Potts Lines found not to include it. It is now in Possession of Philip Insole, who has considerable upland Improvements on it
